Shakespeare wrote poetry. He should sweep streets so well that all the hosts of heaven and earth will pause to say, here lived a great street sweeper who did his job well."


On repentance: "We will have to repent in this generation not merely for the hateful words and actions of the bad people but for the appalling silence of the good people."


**Building Fund Income** for November was \$4,810. Budgeted income per month is \$6,000.

- 1. Donor may recommend a specific subject area or title for consideration.
- 2. Donor may give a donation with a "general use" specification, to be used at the Library Committee's discretion.

The Library Committee will make the final decision on the disposition of any donations. Upon request, an acknowledgment of the donation will be provided for tax purposes.

# **Favorite Recipes**

#### Pumpkin White Chocolate Drops (Pam Cameron)

- 2 cups butter, softened
- 2 cups granulated sugar
- 1 can (16 ounces) solid pack pumpkin
- 2 eggs
- 4 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 bag (12 ounces) white chocolate chips
- 1 container (16 ounces) cream cheese frosting
- 1/4 cup packed brown sugar

Preheat oven to 375°F. Grease cookie sheets. Beat butter and granulated sugar in large bowl until light and fluffy. Add pumpkin and eggs; beat until smooth. Add flour, pumpkin pie spice, baking powder and baking soda; beat just until well blended. Stir in white chocolate chips. Drop dough by teaspoonfuls about 2 inches apart onto prepared cookie sheets. Bake about 16 minutes or until set and bottoms are brown.

Combine frosting and brown sugar in small bowl. Spread on warm cookies. Makes about 6 dozen cookies.

#### Artichoke Dip (Karen Jones)

- 1 can chopped artichoke hearts (not marinated)
- 1 4 oz. can chopped green chilies
- 1 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1 cup mayonnaise

Mix together and bake at 350° for 30 minutes. Serve with chips or bread.

You will need:

• little treasures (photos of friends or family, small toys, coins, etc.)

#### How to make it:

• Wash and dry the tin.

• Decorate the tin with the markers or paint. (If the tin already has a design, you can use that one. Or you can decorate pieces of paper and then glue them to the

Mark your name and the date on the lid.



 On a piece of paper make a list of goals – things you would like to accomplish during the year. (For example, be a better student, be more helpful around the house, make new friends, etc.)

• On another piece of paper write some of the important things that happened last year. (For example, got a new puppy, went on a fun vacation, learned to ride a bike, etc.)


 Place the list of goals in the tin along with any little treasures you want to include.

Epiphany is the Christian festival celebrated each year on January 6. Along with Christmas, Easter and Pentecost, it is one of the oldest Christian holy days.

The festival was first celebrated in the Eastern Church (Orthodox) and was adopted in the Western church by the fourth century. Epiphany commemorates the first "showing forth" or manifestation of Jesus to the Gentiles, particularly the Magi or Wise Men. The Epiphany story is meant to explain that Christ was not just for the Jews, but for non-Jews (Gentiles) as well, anywhere in the world.

The eve of Epiphany is called Twelfth Night and relates to the arrival of the Wise Men from the East at the birthplace of the Lord in Bethlehem.
