Book Review

"The Dead Sea Scrolls" by Millar Burrows

This is a complete account of the great archeological find of 1947 that touched off a series of events which have excited Bible scholars and others as have few similar happenings of the Christian era. These manuscripts were found in a cave near the site of an ancient ruin called Khirbet Qumran. They constitute the richest find of early biblical material to be made in centuries. This book covers the discovery of the scrolls, the attempts to date the manuscripts, their content, and an explanation of their significance.

The early scrolls contained the complete book of Isaiah, the rules of an ancient and unknown religious order, a somewhat damaged copy of the lost book of Lamech, a commentary on the book of Habakkuk and a collection of "Thanksgiving Psalms" that were hitherto unknown.

It is an interesting supplement to anyone eager to delve deeper into early origins of our Bible. You will find it in our library under the call number 220.4/Bur.




Featured TPC Member of the Month Herb Zachow




