A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KEN

Dear friends,

How are your New Year's resolutions going? Have you taken that walk? Read that book, yet? You know churches make resolutions, too. One of the resolutions we made last year was to make our annual congregational meeting more understandable, engaging, and something that actually adds value to our life together rather than something we check off our things-we're-supposed-to-do-but-aren't-totally-sure-why list.

Our meetings in the past have suffered from at least three challenges: 1) The congregation receives the budget on the same day of the meeting giving them no time to really reflect on it in any meaningful way; 2) There is no time in one meeting to really dig into the budget to understand it; 3) The congregation has exhibited confusion over what they're being asked to do- is the session asking the congregation for feedback, approval, or something else?

So here's what we're going to try. On January 27th we will hold our annual congregational meeting in which we review the 2008 budget, elect the 2008 nominating committee, and vote on the pastoral terms of call. In addition to this we're going to hold a "meeting before the meeting" on January 13th after worship. This will not be an official congregational meeting, and as such we can be a little more flexible in how we use our time.

First, we will hear a brief financial report on 2007, see what the session most wants to accomplish in 2008, and then see a draft of the proposed budget for 2008.

Then, as your moderator, I will welcome all questions regarding the budget. As this will be a time for learning, all questions regarding the budget will be welcome.

Finally, after asking questions, we will meet in small groups for discussion and to offer suggestions to the session about the budget. A really helpful suggestion will shed light on an area

where the session might change the budget in order to more accurately reflect our values and priorities for the year ahead. After a set amount of time, a leader from every small group will read the suggestions aloud to the entire gathering. After offering suggestions, we will then re-gather the body and close in prayer. The session will then engage these questions and suggestions at their January meeting.

The last thing I want to share is a fun tool we'll put to use at both the "meeting before the meeting" and the annual congregational meeting. It's a tool developed from the Uniting Church of Australia, and which our session used during their fall retreat. Everyone who comes to these meetings will be given an orange piece of paper and a blue piece of paper. At any point in time the moderator will ask the group how they feel about a particular answer, suggestion, or about whether they are ready to move on with the business. If you feel warmly towards what is going on, you will raise the orange piece of paper. If you have a concern about what's going on, you will raise the blue paper. Since these colors don't make a motion and don't represent a formal vote, people can feel more at ease sharing their feelings and concerns. And as the moderator this gives me really helpful non-verbal feedback about the group that helps me make sure we're presenting and discussing issues in a clear manner and that we're not moving too quickly. (Plus, it turns out that these colors are just fun to wave around and often provide a much needed opportunity to laugh.)

So, I hope to see you after worship on the 13th and the 27th. I really believe these changes will be positive and will make these meetings both more engaging and, most importantly, more productive.


