

### MISSION COMMITTEE REPORT

February is Mission Month! We will highlight outreach and service activities in which TPC and its congregational members are involved.

**Moment for Mission:** We all attend worship service on Sunday and are energized and challenged by Ken's sermons, inspired by the music we hear, and thoughtful of the scripture we read. Yet, there are six other days of the week. Apart from Sunday, how do we live and work to reflect Christ's personal call to us to serve? Each week we will hear from a different member of our congregation relating their personal call. Their stories are interesting and varied. Come and hear.

**Adult Mission Trips:** The Mission Committee will again sponsor an adult mission trip to Bend to work with Habitat for Humanity. It will be structured similarly to last year, departing on a Sunday after worship and working for three days in the Bend area. The dates are still being finalized, but we are targeting July or August for this trip. Additionally, we will sponsor two one-day Saturday projects here in the greater Portland area. Look for dates in the late spring and early fall for these two efforts. Stay tuned – as dates are finalized, we will let you know.

**Advent/Christmas Recap:** the congregation is truly generous and whole-heartedly supported the various opportunities to give and share the meaning of Christmas during the holiday season. Here is a short recap: Janus Tree – 320 items; Giving Tree – 5 families (8 adults, 17 children) and \$740 for food baskets; Cookie Sale – \$750; Advent Conspiracy – \$1,279; Christmas Memorials – \$675; and Christmas Joy Offering – \$872. Thank you all for your very generous support.

**Birthday Chicken Proceeds:** The Mission Committee has recommended a change to the recipient of the proceeds from the Birthday Chicken. For as long as memory serves, monies have gone to Heifer International. While this organization has a good program and receives strong support, it is not particularly cost efficient. Less than 70% of monies received go to the intended projects with 30% going to administrative and fund raising efforts. We would like to see our donations used more effectively and to designate Medical Teams International as the recipient for the coming year. There are three principal reasons for the change: first, it is a local organization; second, many members of the congregation are directly involved in their activities; and third, 99% of monies received goes to their projects. Their administrative load is just 1%. This change is for one year and will be reviewed annually.

- Approval was given to a mission committee recommendation for a one-year project to redirect "Birthday Chicken" monies to Medical Teams International. Heifer International will continue to be supported through the children's education project and Christmas giving program.

#### Committee Reports and Other Information:

- The mortgage debt was paid off in December. The mortgage fund ended the year with a surplus of \$1,800. The general fund ended the year with a deficit that was \$4,000 more than anticipated.
- The fellowship and member integration elder reported on plans to develop three teams to facilitate outreach and member connection.

## CONGRATS!

Nick Dannemiller, Eagle Scout, 19 years old, and 2012 graduate of Tualatin High School was elected to be the National Chief of the Order of the Arrow. Nick was Wauna La-Mon'tay's



Lodge Chief for 2011-12, and is serving a second term (2012-13, 2013-14) as Section W1S Chief for three lodges in Oregon, SW Washington and Northern California. He was elected by the many Section Chiefs from across the nation at the National Order of the Arrow's National Planning meeting in Dallas Texas on Dec 27. Nick is a member of Tualatin's Troop 530, member of Tualatin Presbyterian Church, and previously served on the Oregon Zoo Teens Leadership Corps for 5 years, member of the Tualatin High wrestling team and Wind Ensemble for 4 years. Since the beginning of his scouting career as a cub scout at Byrom Elementary School, Nick has provided many hours of community service with the scouts, his school activities, and for the City of Tualatin.

As the 2014 National Chief, Nick will manage the planning of the 2015 OA caravan that will be traveling across the United States, provide the BSA's report to the nation to our US President, as well as lead Regional and Section Chiefs across the nation in the preparation of the activities for the 100th anniversary of the National Order of the Arrow's Conference held at Michigan State in August of 2015.

The Order of the Arrow is Scouting's national honor society. Its membership fulfills the Order's purpose of recognizing those who exemplify Scouting's values, promoting responsible outdoor adventure, developing young leaders, and crystallizing the Scout habit of helpfulness into a life purpose of leadership in cheerful service to others. Established in 1915, the OA emphasizes service to the unit. In this way, Arrowmen give back to their troops with the leadership skills and values of service learned through the Order. The Order's program complements the troop's, providing valuable leadership training programs, world-class high adventure opportunities, and exciting national conferences. Members of the Order of the Arrow are chosen through an election process at a troop meeting.

The organization that Nick now leads has 178,000 members not just in the US but Europe and 6 Far East countries. A servant leader organization, it works to provide service to scouting and the nation as well as develop leadership skills in youth. Nick will spend this entire year leading and representing the top scouts in the Nation, traveling over 175 days. Nick is the first from the Cascade Pacific Council to obtain this role of leadership.
