


THE REV. DR. KEN HENRY IS HERE!!!!!



Greetings! My name is Ken Henry, and I will soon be the new Interim Pastor at Tualatin Presbyterian Church. Over the past 35 years of pastoral ministry, I have served Presbyterian congregations in Santa Cruz, CA; Vancouver, WA; Eugene, OR; San Jose, CA and, most recently, in Charlottesville, VA. I also taught communication studies for three years at Northwest Christian College in Eugene.

I received my Doctor of Ministry degree from Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary and my interim pastor training from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. I attended San Francisco Theological Seminary and Princeton Theological Seminary for my Masters of Divinity. And yet, with all my traveling from

here to there and back again, my roots (and heart) have always remained in Oregon.

I graduated from Beaverton High and Western Oregon State College. I'm an Oregon native and am so grateful to be back on the West Coast. I grew up at Valley Community Presbyterian Church in Raleigh Hills and even met my wife, Heather, there. GREEN LIGHTS AND PARKING SPACES

One Sunday morning about nine months ago, I found myself in Marietta, Georgia at Christ the King Anglican Church listening to Father Tony Melton's sermon. It took me by surprise. I couldn't believe what he was saying. I'd never heard those words before, and they resonated with something deep inside me. Maybe I didn't have to feel embarrassed or silly. Maybe I really could ignore those people who had ridiculed me the few times I had shared my secret. Maybe I didn't have to keep a secret. What a freeing possibility.

I wouldn't say I left church that morning a totally changed person. But I had reframed an important part of my way of being in the world. I left church feeling normal. Not childish. Not naïve. Not obsessive. Not irrational. Normal.

So here goes. I'm going to share my secret. Ever since I was a child growing up in a scary and totally dysfunctional household, I have prayed for everything I needed. And I mean everything. I still do. I pray for green lights and parking spaces, especially at the airport. I pray for safe lane changes on the freeway and strength to unscrew tight jar lids. I pray for short waits at the meat counter and the location of misplaced keys. I am praying for words as I write this.

My old college classmate, Elaine, thinks I'm ridiculous. The last time I visited her we tried to go to an art fair but couldn't find a parking place. Instead, we drove to another neighborhood where we were able to park and enjoyed a glass of wine at a nearby restaurant. Elaine wanted to know if I had prayed for a parking place. Of course, I had. It's what I do. She proceeded to tell me that my prayer hadn't worked. Why do I bother to pray for things that don't work? If the prayer had "worked," we'd be at the art fair. Didn't I know that an omnipotent, omniscient, and omnipresent God is going to do what such a God wants? And there is nothing we can do about it. Why should a rational, educated woman like me engage in such childish behavior? She sounded really irked and I wondered if I had hit a raw nerve of some sort. I wish Father Tony had been there.

Father Tony said in his sermon that as Christians we should pray for everything, the more prayers the better. One reason for prayer is that with each prayer, we acknowledge to God and to ourselves that we are totally and completely dependent on God to meet our needs.

We might do well to consider God's words to Abraham. "You will be my people and I will be your God." Perhaps asking God to meet our needs is what we are to do as God's people. Perhaps making provision is what God does as our God. Is it possible that what comes to us after we pray is God's provision, whether it's a happy windfall or strength to endure the unbearable? We ask and God provides. Ask and look for provision. Ask and look for provision. Could that be one way of walking with God?

WHAT DO DAMAR HAMLIN AND ALAN GROBEY HAVE IN COMMON?

They both survived sudden cardiac arrest.

August 2021 changed our lives forever. Alan and I had gone to bed after a typical summer day. However, in the middle of the night I woke to Alan snoring unusually. I elbowed him once. When he didn't respond, I elbowed him again and called his name. Not getting a response again, I turned on the light. His color was not good and he wasn't breathing. I immediately called 911 and started CPR. After 17 minutes of CPR, the paramedics finally arrived and took over. After 45 more minutes of CPR and defibrillation, they were able to get a consistent heartbeat and he was rushed to the hospital. Alan walked out of the hospital after nine days in ICU. He has since recovered fully. We continue to thank God for every day we are given!

I cannot express enough gratitude for the first responders and doctors and nurses who were a part of Alan's survival & recovery. I am thankful for the CPR training that I had over 20 years ago. Although the 911 dispatcher was instrumental in coaching me through that night (she was my lifeline!), I know the prior CPR training helped me to quickly and confidently administer the lifesaving procedure.

I NEVER thought I would ever need to use my CPR training. I am learning that those who have, have often had to use it on their loved ones. I am ready to take a refresher CPR class and am looking forward to learning how to use an AED. Anyone want to join me?

We lost our 11-year-old son in April 2015. After 8 years living in the bushes of Washington County, we received a life saving gift. Hopeless in our circumstances out of no where we were given hope. We literally lived in the darkness. Family Promise of Tualatin Valley was the light that reached in to save US!!! Family Promise led us out of the death sentence of homelessness. They gave us shelter and a start at re-entering life. FP is C.P.R breathing life into us as human beings. Bringing us back to life from a life of death. Gratitude is all we have. When no one else cared; our family, friends, it was a stranger who found worth in us as human beings to remind us that we are human."

RECIPE FROM SOUPER BOWL SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 12, 2023 BEST EVER CHILI RECIPE - Pam Cameron

1 T olive oil

1 small onion, diced

1 green pepper, diced

2 garlic cloves, minced

2 lbs lean ground beef

2 C beef broth (more)

1 8-oz can tomato sauce

1 15-oz can diced tomatoes, undrained

1 15-oz can pinto beans

1 15-oz can kidney beans

3 T chili powder

1 T oregano

1 tsp cumin

1 tsp coriander

1 tsp salt

- 1. In a large pot add the olive oil over medium high heat. Add the onion, bell pepper and garlic and saute until almost tender. Add in the ground beef and cook and crumble until brown.
- 2. Add in the beef broth, tomato sauce, diced tomatoes, pinto beans, kidney beans, chili powder, oregano, cumin, coriander, salt and cayenne.
- 3. Bring to a boil and reduce to a simmer until it starts to thicken and flavors combine, about 30 minutes.
