No one else needs to see your responses. There will be no grades listed. This is for your use to better see how your journey is progressing. Blessings on your trip.

1. Who was the first person you knew loved you? How did you experience that?
2. Who was the first person you loved? How did they experience that?
3. When did you know that God loved you? What occurred to make you know that?
4. Has God disappointed you? Have you disappointed God?
5. From whom have you received forgiveness? Who have you forgiven? What were those experiences like?

I have two favorite biblical verses/concepts that challenge and help me in my journey:

Mark 9:24 (NRSV)

Immediately the father of the child cried out, "I believe; help my unbelief!"

Mark 12:30-31 (NRSV)

you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' [31] The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these."

Bibles for 4th graders will be presented during Worship on Sunday, April 13.

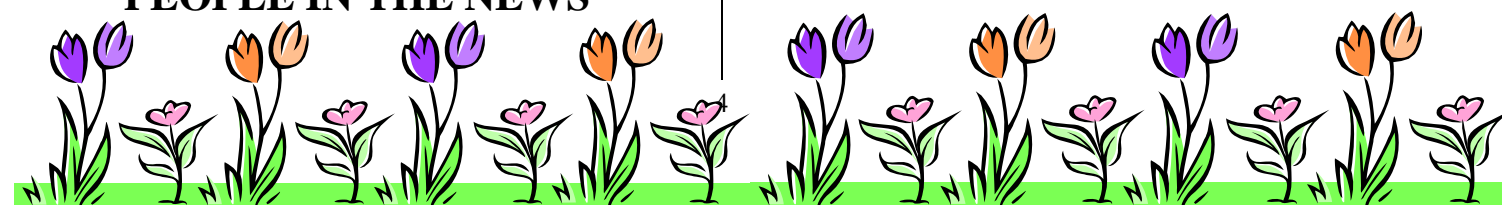
Kids in Worship

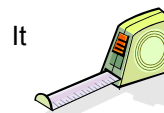


Adult Mission Trip

The Mission Committee is discussing opportunities for an adult mission trip and would like your input. In the past, the church has had many successful youth mission trips, but has not had one geared strictly for adults. Now is the time! The general format of the trip would be a hands-on work effort of approximately a week's duration. Timing for the trip is undetermined at this point, but would be no sooner than six to nine months from now. We have given thought to the possibility of International, National or Regional trips. Examples might include: 1. a trip to Central America with the objective of providing clean water or needed, basic facilities working with the Presbyterian Border Ministry; 2. a trip to the Gulf Coast to continue with the much needed repair and rebuild after Katrina working with Presbyterian Disaster Assistance; 3. a trip to the Pendleton area to improve existing facilities at a camp and conference center run by the Synod of the Pacific; or 4. a trip to the Weed, California area to construct low income housing working with the local Presbyterian church and Habitat for Humanity.



The opportunities are numerous! It only takes the interest and the willingness of congregational members to participate and serve. We are looking for your thoughts and comments. If an adult mission trip is of interest to you, or if you have other ideas for a trip, or know of other needed efforts, we would like to hear from you.
