WOMEN'S MINISTRY, SAT., MARCH 16 Peace for Paul Foundation

The women who attended the Women's Ministry gathering on Saturday, March 16 learned about a foundation in Uganda that helps children break the cycle of poverty. The group was introduced to this organization by Jackie Norman. Below Jackie shares how she came to know about the Peace for Paul Foundation.



I met Heidi Kaltur back in October 2014 when she became my husband Joel's hospice nurse. She was with me for the last months of his life until he passed in January 2015.

She was an amazing support to me during those difficult months. One day, shortly after he passed, I found her selling raffle tickets as a fund raiser for her orphanage in Uganda. An orphanage in Uganda? News to me!

Back in 2008, after breaking up with a fiancé who was cheating on her, she decided to travel to Uganda and work with a charity in Jinja to help heal her broken heart. While eating at an outdoor cafe one day, she was approached by five street kids who asked to share her lunch. After taking the food, one of them returned, looked her in the eye, and said, "Thank you very much".

Something happened at that moment with Paul (the namesake of Peace for Paul). She made sure that the five boys were cared for after she returned to the states, but couldn't get them out of her mind. They were members of the Karamajong nomadic tribe. Life is difficult for them, as they leave the villages to escape extreme poverty. Children resort to begging. Abductions and sex trafficking are common. With no formal education and speaking a different language, many are unable to find work and resort to drugs or alcohol.

Heidi returned the following year to ensure that these five boys were provided with permanent shelter, education and medical care. What started in 2009, has now grown to 156 children. Half of them live in girls' and boys' dorms, and half of them live at home but are educated and assisted with sponsorship funds. All of these children, who once had little hope of anything other than a life of poverty and despair, are guaranteed an education well into vocational schooling and university.

Heidi's orphanage is one of just three orphanages that remained open after the government recently shut down dozens of other orphanages. Peace for Paul has attained the platinum level of Seal of Transparency by Guidestar by being completely open and transparent. They house, educate, provide medical care and counseling, to these children who have lived very traumatic lives. All of the children participate in chores for the good of all whether it be cleaning and helping with meals, or raising farm animals, or tilling a community garden.

It is the wonder of hope that shines in the eyes of these young people. The original five are now in their late teens and early twenties. As they transition out of the program, they still come back to mentor the young ones, and assist with programs in any way they can. I am always amazed at what Heidi Kaltur has done over the years for these kids. Where there was no hope, there are achievable dreams for each one...guaranteed.

People often ask, "What exactly is a Stephen Minister?" One way to put it is that Stephen Ministers are the After People.

Stephen Ministers are there:

...after the phone call you hoped you'd never get. ...after the divorce papers are served and the bottom falls out of your life.

...after the funeral, when everyone has left and the emotions you've held at bay come crashing in. ...after the doctor says, "I'm sorry, but there's nothing more we can do."

...after the nursing home director shakes your hand and says, "Welcome to your new home."

..after the last child honks the horn, waves, and drives away and the house suddenly seems empty. ...after the gavel goes down, the handcuffs go on, and your loved one is led away.

...after the baby arrives, demanding more of you than you ever dreamed possible.

...after you find a pink slip with your final paycheck.

...after your family and friends have heard your story one too many times, but you still need to talk it out.

Stephen Ministers are the "After People." They are ready to come alongside you and provide comfort and support for as long after as needed.

MUSTARD SAUCE RECIPE

Mustard Sauce for Easter Ham or Vegetables From Carolyn Hale's Grandmother obtained on her honeymoon in Bend, Oregon, 1908.

- 1 T. mustard
- 1 T. flour
- ½ cup vinegar

- Salt and pepper
