When our grandson, Sterling, first came to us I was determined to introduce him to birds. Whenever I would spot the Bushtits at the suet feeder, I would scoop him up and carry him right up next to the feeder. Softly I would whisper, "Sterling, these are the Bushtits. Look at their beautiful eyes; they are your friends." Inevitably he would reach his chubby, baby arms towards them and off they would fly.

Yesterday Dave and I went to The Convention Center to get our vaccine. After a year of staying almost completely away from anyone other than our daughter and son-in-law's immediate family, I was an anxious mess. Looking around the room at the hundreds of masked and distanced people did nothing to quell that uneasy feeling welling inside me. It took every ounce of my resolve to make it to the person



giving me my vaccine. Perhaps she sensed my hesitancy, or as I now choose to believe, she was just an amazing human being, but when I sat down she looked me directly in the eyes. She asked how I was doing. That's all it took for the tears to come.

With masks, so much about us is hidden, unless we have close enough access to see a person's eyes. I can't tell you the name of my RN, but I can tell you when I looked into her eyes, I felt as if I had found myself in the presence of grace.

Bird species, like humans, for the most part, stick to their own. The Finches with Finches, Doves with Doves, Bluebirds with Bluebirds. When the Bushtits arrive, however, look and listen closely. You might see a Chickadee and a Kinglet flying with them. If you get the opportunity to stand really close, look at their eyes. In them you will find kindness, in them you will find peace and in them you will find inclusive-ness.

To quote my RN, "It's been a long year." Here's to seeing beyond masks and into the eyes of love.

PASTOR CHARLIE BROWN

September 8, 1936 - January 8, 2021

On the morning of January 8, 2021, Charlie Brown died in peace surrounded by his family. What do we write about a man who touched so many lives? That he loved his Lord and was fiercely devoted to his family, who loved him deeply and he loved them back!

Charlie was born in Ocilla, Georgia to Bob and Bev Brown and grew up in Yakima, Washington. He graduated from Whitworth College in Spokane, then earned his Master of Divinity from

Princeton Theological Seminary. For Charlie, relationships were an essential part of his ministry. That was evident as an adored pastor, serving congregations throughout California, including a stint as Associate Pastor of First Presbyterian Church in Berkeley, California during the tumultuous 1960's. In 1973, St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Portland, Oregon, extended a call to Charlie as their new Senior Pastor. Edda was the wedding reception coordinator and worked closely with Charlie. Six months after he arrived, she walked into his office and announced "Charlie Brown, I am very strongly attracted to you!" His "I really appreciate that Edda." was NOT the answer she was hoping for. However, 16 months later they were married, blending their five children and eventually, their seven grandchildren and one great-grandchild, into one family. Edda's German family loved Charlie from day one and gleefully brought him into their fold.

As Senior Pastor for 28 years, Charlie preached more than 1500 sermons, officiated hundreds of weddings, including his family's; baptized more than 400 souls, including all seven of his grandchildren; and showed us all how to live and love well. He introduced the power of human touch by inviting the congregation to "join hands and close the center aisle" during the benediction. Strangers soon became friends with his open smile and "Hi, my name is Charlie Brown." Posting himself at the back of the sanctuary, Charlie had a hug ready for anyone who wanted or needed it. For some, we learned, it was the only human touch they received throughout the week. When he retired, his friends remembered him this way "You make hugs doable for all. You made the ages-old Bible user-friendly to everyone."

After retiring as Pastor Emeritus, Charlie's faithful service continued as he played a vital role at Tualatin Presbyterian Church, and performed hundreds of weddings at the American Church in Paris. Edda fondly remembers the wonderful friends they made in "the city of love." In 2016, they moved to Mary's Woods, a loving and supportive retirement community in Lake Oswego.

Charlie was a real Mensch! Our Babo will always be remembered as a loving husband, Dad, brother, uncle, counselor, pastor and friend. Our family is missing our anchor now, but we look to the skies for Charlie to send a rainbow our way!

You're a good man, Charlie Brown!

Charlie is survived by his wife, Edda; and their children, Susan (Tim), Charlie Jr., Steven (Jessica), Cameron (Breanna), and Chris; as well as his grandchildren, Jamie, Jessi, Nick, Alaila, Houston, Casey (Tia), baby Charlie III, and Lily; sister Barbie (Tom) and their children, Andy (Kara) and Jenny (Amit); and extended family in Washington, Georgia, Germany - Harald (Ilona), and friends worldwide.

With COVID we are not able to announce a service at this time, but we will be gathering when it is safe, to remember and celebrate this amazing man. Memorial gifts may be made in Charlie's name to St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Tualatin Presbyterian Church and the Adult Community Center in Lake Oswego.

Greetings to you in the name of our lord and savior Jesus Christ. How is it there and the family? Am well. Thanks for always thinking about me. I appreciate the support that you have sent to me and I received a gift of 174,300 Uganda shillings which helped me to buy the following items:

Two turkeys for 70,000, clothes for 40,000, bed sheets and jacket, 20,000 and fish 4300.

May God richly bless you and the entire congregation. Am happy about the schools. According to the president of Uganda March 1st semi-candidates are going back to school and I am also among the team of people who are going back to school. Thanks be to God.

Here in Uganda we are in a dry season. The sky is clear with very hot days and very cold nights.

We are not doing any garden work this season except clearing the garden for the rainy season.

What is the weather there? What activities do you do in this season?

Despite of the fact that we are in a lock down, we carry so many activities in our project, for example, Bible study. Please share with me this scripture: I Corinthians 11:1-2 which says "Follow my example as I follow the example of Christ the Savior." It's my favorite verse over this season. Bye Bye Sarah
