"I Am A Visitor"

Won't you please...

- ... Smile at me as I walk in the door. You are my first impression of the church, during the first few moments I am in your building, and this first impression will probably stay with me a long time.
- ...Help me find my place in the service. I will not find your help an intrusion. In fact, I will remember your kindness.
- ... Speak to me during the fellowship time after worship. I know you want to see your friends and settle that piece of committee business.
- ...Tell me good things about your church and your minister. I want to believe that I have come to a place where people love each other and where they believe that they are doing something exciting and important for the Lord.
- ... Notice me even if I am not a "family." I don't want to feel left out just because I am unmarried, a single parent, a teenager, or an older person.
- ...Talk to me again the second week when I come back, and the third and fourth. I am still not a part of your congregational family.
- ...Invite me to become part of some church group or activity. I need more than worship every Sunday. I need to know that I am accepted and affirmed by a group of people within the church who know me by my first name and who care about me as an individual.
- ...If you can find it in your heart to do these things for me, I will come back...the second week, the third, and maybe forever. I will worship with you, join your choir, work at your

events, teach your Sunday School, contribute to your projects, and become a highly involved member of your church; and in so doing, I will find my own life immeasurable enriched as a result of having become a member of your church.

The Birth of Mother's Day

Anna M. Jarvis (1864-1948) loved her mother dearly. It was Miss Jarvis who first suggested a national day to honor all

mothers. At a memorial service for her mother on May 10, 1908, Anna gave a carnation, her mother's favorite flower, to each person in attendance. Within a few years, the idea to honor mothers gained popularity, and Mother's Day was soon observed annually in many large cities of the United States.

On May 9, 1914, by an Act of Congress, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed the second Sunday of May as Mother's Day. He established the day as a time for "public expression of our love and reverence for the mothers of our country." By then, it had become customary to wear white carnations in honor of departed mothers and red carnations to honor the living. The custom continues to this day.


for someone you love

You will need:

- colored construction paper
- * 2 green pipe cleaners
- * small flower pot
- reen florist foam (to fit in pot)
- & scissors
- stape
- @ glue
- a photo of you!

How to make it:

- & Cut out your face from the photo. Make it a circle about 1-1/2" round.
- Fold a piece of colored paper in half and cut out 2 flower shapes.
- & Glue your round photo in the center of one flower.
- Make a stem by folding a pipe cleaner in half and twisting it to make it stronger.
- * Glue or tape the "stem" to the back of the flower that has your picture.
- Glue the other flower to the back of the first one. Make sure the "stem" is in between and sticks out from the bottom.
- © Cut the other pipe cleaner in half to make leaves and then attach them to the "stem."
- * Put the green foam in the pot.
- Plant your flower in the foam.
- Give the flower pot to someone you love.
