A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KEN



Dear friends,

It's been a busy couple of months of interviewing candidates for our position of music director as well as for pastoral coverage during my upcoming sabbatical this summer. As a final newsletter from me before I turn my phone off and unplug my laptop, I thought I'd share a little bit about who these amazing people are:

MUSIC DIRECTOR

Emily Bavaro

I'll start with Emily Bavaro, our new director of music! Emily was a wonderful surprise for me. Much of her experience and education are from New York City, but her resume declared a Tualatin address. At first I assumed she had just grown up here but was living in NYC. Not so! She and her family moved to Tualatin to be closer to family last fall during the pandemic, and NYC's loss is our gain! Emily is no stranger to the Pacific Northwest or Presbyterianism having grown up attending First Presbyterian Church in Salem.



After graduating from St. Olaf College with a degree in vocal performance in 2009, Emily earned her Master of Music in Classical Voice from The Manhattan School of Music in 2011. In New York she served as an organist, cantor, and music director at various Roman Catholic and Episcopal congregations. Emily is also a gifted teacher, having taught piano, organ, and voice for years. Like Dr. Ron, Emily is just an absolute gift, and we are so grateful to have her join us!

SABBATICAL COVERAGE

Another surprise here, at first I assumed we would hire one person to cover my sabbatical, as we did seven years ago. But wiser voices on session noted this could be a great opportunity for us to hear from a greater range of voices. We interviewed five candidates and settled on three. One person will cover each month, and their responsibilities are to preach and lead worship, lead morning prayer during the week, and moderate our zoom room after worship. The grant covers their pay, and we have also been able to use grant money to augment The Rev. Dr. Dick Wiggers' compensation as he will be moderating session and caring for emergent situations on the ground while I'm gone.

It was a joy interviewing all of the candidates, and I'm pleased to present the three the committee settled on and the session approved:

Elle Dowd (she/her/hers)...

...is a bi-furious recent graduate of the <u>Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago</u> and a candidate for ordained ministry in the <u>Evangelical Lutheran Church in America</u>.

Elle has pieces of her heart in Sierra Leone, where her two children were born, and in St. Louis where she learned from the radical, queer, Black leadership during the <u>Ferguson Uprising</u>.

She was formerly a co-conspirator with the movement to #decolonizeLutheranism and currently works as a community organizer with the <u>Faith and Justice Collective</u> and <u>SOUL</u>, writes regularly for the <u>Disrupt Worship Project</u>, and facilitates workshops on gender and sexuality and the Church in both secular conferences and Christian spaces. She is currently working on a book with Broadleaf to be released summer of 2021.

Telika McCoy, Ph.D.

Dr. Telika McCoy is a native of Winston-Salem, North Carolina. She earned a sociology degree from Shaw University and a Master of Divinity degree from Shaw Divinity School, graduating with honors. While attending seminary, she was mentored and taught by Dr. Gardner C. Taylor, making her one of the few theologians to claim such education. In 2011, she earned a Ph.D. in human services from Capella University in Minneapolis, MN. Her scientific research explored the lived experiences of aspiring pastors and people with disabilities in faith communities.

Dr. McCoy has advised Ph.D. students as a peer mentor at Capella University and is a member of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. She volunteered with the Ministers Conference of Winston-Salem, served as assistant support coordinator for the Women in Ministry Division of the General Baptist State Convention of NC (GBSC), Inc., and currently holds the office of 4th Vice President of the Congress of Christian Education Division of the GBSC. For two years, Dr. McCoy was a full-time Doctor of Ministry degree mentor and lead faculty of the Christian Education Division for Apex School of Theology in Durham, NC.

Currently, Dr. McCoy serves as youth pastor of Mount Peace Baptist Church, facilitates interactive workshops and discussion forums, and is a post contributor to *GBSConline.org*. She has published two books: *That Child! Preparing for Challenging Moments with Youth* and *That Day! Enjoy the One You Have – Improve the One to Come*. In her leisure, she enjoys the outdoors, reading, writing and riding her Harley Davidson Iron-883 motorcycle.

Pastor Emily (they/them) is originally from Colorado, but currently works as Social Justice Pastor of Trinity Las Américas UMC in Des Moines. Pastor Emily cohosts the podcast Nerds At Church, and curates queerying.org, a blog queering and querying the Revised Common Lectionary. They dedicate their life to justice work locally and globally, revel in creativity and art, and are fed by Lutheran theological geekiness.

THOMAS WOODBRIDGE - Video Editor at TPC

In anticipation of Thomas's upcoming graduation from George Fox University, Mike Shiffer asked Thomas several questions.

What is your degree and what does it mean?

My degree is titled "Cinema and Media Communications and Organization" with a concentration in Video Production. My most favorite food? That depends, home cooked or restaurant, sweet or savory, gourmet or comfort food? Does it have to be one item or could it be a full meal? Is it seasonal, could it be a beverage? There are just so many variables and I enjoy many different things for many different reasons.

My very most soul-feeding activity? Helping others, or offering a great listening ear. Standing outside in the crisp, cold morning air and

watching the world awakening. Poetry, music, fellowship. Sending handwritten notes, playing with our grandsons. Again, too many possibilities to narrow it down to one.

Speaking of foods and eating, I realize I have never addressed the feeding of these friends which I share with you each month. Although this is a photo of a Spotted Towhee, which is mainly a ground forager, this month I want to share about the feeding of hummingbirds. Since the weather is getting warmer, cleaning and maintenance of your feeders is paramount. A good rule of thumb is to change the nectar at least twice a week during the cooler months. When the weather begins hitting the seventies, every three days is preferable. In extreme heat, every two days is ideal. Wash the feeders with very hot water and scrub all areas well with a bottle brush or a toothbrush and the special brushes which can be purchased to get in the tiny feeding holes. This is necessary to keep bacteria from growing and forming black mold which many times can result in the death of these beautiful flying jewels. Every month or so, soak the feeder in a solution of vinegar and hot water for twenty minutes then rinse. I only fill the feeders with enough food to last until the next cleaning and filling, so there is no need to fill it and have to waste all that simple syrup.

Nectar recipe: Mix one part white sugar to four parts boiling water. Stir until dissolved, and cool prior to filling the feeder. Any unused syrup may be refrigerated. Note, do not use raw or brown sugar, or honey.
