The process of reviewing the candidates and evaluating our top choices will continue for the next several months. During this time your PNC will be hard at work as we carefully consider the candidates to find the right person for TPC.


Please continue to keep the PNC in your prayers as we enter this phase of our search.

WHAT I'M READING THIS SUMMER

This summer, I'm planning to read two books that spark my pastoral and personal interests. The first book is Losing Our Religion: An Altar Call for Evangelical America by Russell Moore. Although Moore tells readers his book is a "way to move forward for confused and wounded evangelicals," I am intrigued by the fact that Russell was excommunicated from evangelical leadership circles because he would not endorse Donald Trump as President. This book raises issues of politics, faith, personal convictions, and how political party affiliations can skew our understanding of following Christ. Moore writes, "Let me tell you about ongoing racism and nationalism trying to masquerade as Jesus." If you're interested in reflecting on how to be a thoughtful Christian in midst of any election year, this might be your book.



This summer, I'm also going to be reading

David Brooks' new book, How to Know a Person: The Art of Seeing Others Deeply and Being Seen. Obviously, this book is a departure from Moore's treatise on faith and politics, and yet . . . if you are a person who continues to struggle with interpersonal challenges, this book might be worth your time and energy. Brooks writes: "There is one skill that lies at the heart of any healthy person, family, school, community organization, or society: the ability to see someone else deeply and make them feel seen—to accurately know another person, to let them feel valued, heard, and understood."

I'm reading these books because I'm hoping these two authors will inform, comfort, challenge, and touch a deeper need within me: the need to learn and grow as a person seeking God's loving presence in

the messiness of humanity. Paul Tillich once wrote that faith "is the state of being grasped by an ultimate concern." I'm concerned about these issues and I'm sure many of you share my concern.

PENTECOST OFFERING - EMBRACING HOPE

Annually here at TPC we support four denominational offerings of the wider Presbyterian Church. Pentecost holds deep significance and symbolizes the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the church. As such, the Pentecost Offering is targeted at the future of the church – our youth.

The Offering supports three specific ministries:

Young Adult Volunteers – provides an opportunity for young adults to spend a year serving in various communities through mission work;

Ministries in Youth – supports youth-focused programs such as summer camps, conferences and leader-ship development programs;

Child Advocacy – advocates for the rights and well-being of children around the world.

Normally, the entire proceeds of a special offering are forwarded to the national church. This one is different. TPC retains 40% of the local offering for use to support our youth and the ministries they are involved with. The Mission Committee, together with the Director of Family Ministries, have elected to direct TPC's portion of the proceeds to the program in which our young adults are actively engaged: The Good Neighbor Center.

The Pentecost Offering will be taken on Pentecost Sunday, May 19th.

THE BUDDY BACKPACK PROGRAM NOW CALLED "PACKED WITH PRIDE"

The Buddy Backpack Program we supported in the past has a newname and distribution model. It is now called "Packed with Pride." and is owned by the non-profit Foundation for Tigard and Tualatin Schools.

The food program started in March, 2020 due to COVID 19 closing schools. Over 400 food boxes were distributed on each first and third Wednesdays. The food boxes were designed to feed a family of 5 for two weeks. The food box pick up site is located at the Tigard Swim Center parking lot by Tigard High School.

Pennies in the birthday chicken is a TPC tradition. It was initiated by our founding pastor, Rev. Dr. Thom Nelson and has continued to this day. Our pastors may come and go, but the chicken remains.

Why do we do this? To build community. To welcome people. To include people. To engage with people. To challenge our math skills. To share a laugh. Everyone has a birthday!

Why a chicken basket? Probably because initially monies collected were donated to the Heifer Project. Currently monies received are donated to Medical Teams International.
