Book Review

"All the Women in the Bible" by The Reverend Christine M. Carpenter is one of the newer additions to our church library. It is a refreshing look at a woman's place in the Christian world. The author has a Master's Degree in Speech Communication and is serving as director of Christian Women's Ministries in Portland.



According to the book's introduction: "Today's woman is influenced by the Judeo-Christian tradition toward females. Often the Bible has been used against females: to discount the young, accuse the adult, and marginalize the aged. This book departs from the tradition of using Bible women as models of who and what the world wants them to and takes a fresh look at who and what women were before, during, and after their encounters with Jesus. As Bible women are devilified and dethroned through a more accurate rendering of the scriptures, today's woman is freed from being classified as either Jezebel or the Madonna ---those in between getting little or no recognition.

Now as then, a woman who comes into the presence of Jesus is given what she needs and more. In response to Jesus, women experience him in unique ways. "All the Women in the Bible: The Women Around Jesus" will journey with and open the door to Jesus for individuals and groups who are seeking to find the presence and power of Jesus blessing and working in their lives today."
