Marc's TPC Mob - Ride to Defeat ALS

The Marc Olson family has been a vital and integral part of TPC for an extended period of time. With the news of Marc's devastating diagnosis, the Mission Committee considered how we could show our support for them in some tangible way.

The local chapter of the national ALS Association conducts an annual charity bicycle ride, this year on **Saturday**, **July 20th**. Proceeds from the ride go towards efforts to develop effective treatments and, importantly, to search for a cure. The TPC Mission Committee asked Chip Kyle to form a team to participate in this year's ride, calling it "Marc's TPC Mob" and we are asking you to help in the effort.

There are two ways to help: sign up to be one of the riding team members with Chip; or, contribute to reaching the team's goal of raising \$2,500. If you would like to ride, there is a modest registration fee and a commitment to raise \$150 (which would be part of our overall team goal). There are multiple, optional distances to ride: 3, 25, 50, 62 and 75 miles. The ride starts and ends in Mt. Angel. It's a great opportunity for us to show support and contribute to finding a cure. In February, the SCAM message was actually a little better, a little more potentially convincing using a from address of ken.tpcspirit@gmail.com

On the Sunday after this first occurred in February, Ken made a pulpit announcement about it. Two or three weeks ago another Presbyterian Church in the Portland area was on the 6:00 news telling about how this SCAM had hit their church. This month, a couple members have received this SCAM. Going forward, check the email address of the sender; they may not be who they say they are in the body of the email.
