

HOW DO YOU EAT AN ELEPHANT?

Questions and Answers About Searching For a New Pastor by Rev. Ken Henry, Interim Pastor

For the next several months, I hope this column, "How Do You Eat An Elephant?" will help answer any questions you may have regarding how Presbyterians go about calling pastors to serve their congregations. Laying aside the answer "One bite at a time," Presbyterians do have an ordered process for calling pastors and getting congregations ready to receive new pastoral leadership.

What is a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) and when can we have one?

The TPC Session is currently creating a timeline for both a meaningful and expedient search process. So far, this timeline includes an online survey, small group informational gatherings, re-writing the current mission statement (i.e. found in the bulletin each Sunday) and answering certain questions that will guide the PNC in their work. According to *The Book of Order*:

The Session shall call a congregational meeting to elect a pastor nominating committee (PNC) that shall be representative of the whole congregation. The committee's duty shall be to nominate a pastor for election by the congregation." (G-2.0802)

We have yet to determine how large the PNC committee will be, but the Session hopes to have a congregational meeting by mid-October to nominate and elect a PNC.

Who can serve on the PNC? Who can vote for the new pastor?

If you are an active member and on the membership rolls of Tualatin Presbyterian Church, you could be asked to serve on the PNC. Other qualifications for serving on this very important committee are as follows: worship attendance, committee involvement, leadership, and a passion for the current and future life of this congregation. The Session will also be looking to nominate members who are faithful, loving, supportive, and willing to work cooperatively with other committee members. <u>Only active members</u> can vote for the new pastor. Again, according to the *Book of Order*, "All active members of the congregation are entitled to vote. [This includes] calling a pastor, co-pastor, or associate pastor." (G-1.0501, G-1.0503)

That said, if you want to serve on the PNC or vote for the next pastor, consider becoming an active member this summer. I know some of you have attended TPC for several years now. Why not become a member? Maybe, this is right time. It's not that hard.



What's the name of that very cute stuffed elephant in the narthex? We have yet to assign an official name to the church elephant. But we're open to suggestions. If you have a name that fits, please let Sarah Beck or Susan Springer know. Everyone and every creature needs a name--even elephants.

On Sunday, June 11 there will be a short dedication service after worship at the Peace Pole located near the Tualatin Presbyterian Church sign at the corner of Boones Ferry Road and S.W. Siletz Drive.

WHAT IS A PEACE POLE? In 1955 a Japanese Philosopher, Masahisa Goi, coined the phrase "May Peace Prevail on Earth." By 1976 the idea of placing Peace Poles on display as a visual representation of Peace began to grow. With over 200,000 Peace Poles displayed worldwide, they come in an variety of languages, materials and sizes. The languages on the signs are selected by the sponsoring organization and generally represent the population in the community.

HERE IS THE 4TH OF 5 RECIPES FROM SOUPER BOWL SUNDAY SOUP & CHILI TASTING

CROCK POT CHICKEN TACO CHILI, recipe from Susan Cameron

1 onion, chopped
 1 16-oz can black beans, do not drain
 1 16-oz can kidney beans, do not drain
 1 8-oz tomato sauce (more)
 1 10-oz package frozen corn kernels
 1 14.5 oz can diced tomatoes with chilies
 1 14.5 oz can diced tomatoes
 1 packet of taco seasoning
 1 T cumin
 1 T chili powder
 3 boneless skinless chicken breasts
 Chili peppers - optional
 Chopped fresh cilantro

Combine ALL is a slow cooker. Place chicken on top and cover. Cook on low for 10 hours or on high for 6 hours. Half hour before serving, remove chicken and shred. Return chicken to slow cooker and stir in. Top with fresh cilantro. Other good toppings are sour cream, shredded cheddar cheese, and avocado.
