MISSION STUDY UPDATE



The past weeks have been filled with activity as the Mission Study Committee has been gathering information through the survey and getting personal

feed back from the congregation in the small group discussion groups. 138 surveys were turned in and the data were analyzed by PERCEPT, a national firm that helps churches with gathering information for mission studies. The data were presented to members of the TPC congregation at two meetings, June 8 and 9. Forty-eight people attended these two meetings. Not all of the small group discussions have completed, but Session is concerned that there are many people who still may wish to join in on the discussions, but were unable to fit the meetings into their schedules. The mission study committee has been asked by Session to offer a few more opportunities for group discussions. Even if you did not fill out the survey or attend the large group, you are welcome and encouraged to let your thoughts be known. The committee will put together several more opportunities for you to participate in This is very important. the coming weeks. It is the information on which the Pastor Nominating Committee develops the church profile that will attract our new Pastor.

Session has requested that a rough draft of the mission study be ready for the Session/Deacon Retreat August 22 and 23. The ultimate goal is to have the final draft ready for Session to approve in September.



What's happening in our search for a Pastor, or How much of the iceberg is melted?

The process needed to call a new pastor is proceeding at a steady pace. The mission study is well underway. The survey filled out in May has been analyzed by PERCEPT and the report returned to the committee. The demographic information about the community obtained from PERCEPT is currently being written into a descriptive statement. When small group the discussions are complete, the committee will begin compiling the information and writing the description of TPC as we are now and hope to be in the future.

So how much of the iceberg is gone? Almost half. We are 11 months into the transition process and this is about where we expected to be if we follow the Presbytery's rule of thumb that says it takes about one month for each year the previous pastor served to reach the point of calling the new pastor. Thom Nelson was here 21 years so that would suggest a 21-month process at the minimum.

Session and the mission study committee request your prayers as they continue this awesome responsibility.

Church general fund income for May was 11% (\$1437) below the budgeted amount. The expenses were very close to budget. Early in 2003 we had a large surplus. This is the third month in a row that income has been below our budget. With typical summer giving patters we will likely fall below our budgeted net income. Please don't forget the church over the summer.

The building fund income in May was \$3,215. The targeted amount is \$5,000 per month.

Crystal Shearer has been on the TPC staff for just over a month. Already we are seeing great growth in our program. Thank you Crystal for your skills, enthusiasm, faith, spirit, smiles and all that other good stuff you bring to us. We are so lucky to have you.

When we made the decision to hire a youth director we moved \$20,000 from the church contingency fund into a special fund to pay for this position. At that time the congregation was challenged to match that amount and more. In order to continue to have a great program we need to know that the congregation supports our youth program. You can do that with your time, your talents and yes, your financial contributions. You can talk to Crystal about ways that you can help with time and talent. You can contribute to the youth fund along with your regular offering (be sure to indicate the portion of your contribution that is for youth) or you can make a separate youth pledge. Remember our kids!






















MUSIC APPRECIATION SUNDAY June 22, 2003

Here are two fun games you can play during trips in the car!




"NOW!"
