Over the next few days, I hit the trifecta. Not one, but three surgeries in three days. I not only got a new heart valve, but I also had stents installed on my aorta and right carotid artery. Truly, life is what happens when you make other plans.

Having said that, I am so grateful that when things did not go according to plan, that I had three surgeons who knew what to do and how to do it. I'm also grateful for all of the nurses and aids who cared for me during the two weeks I was in the hospital - not only looking after all of my physical needs, but also for those who cheered me on until I was ready to return home.

As many of you know, getting through a medical ordeal like this takes teamwork, prayer, and loving support. Being surrounded by family who came from New York, Chicago, Boston, and Honolulu, before, during, and after my surgery, was a tremendous help to Jeni and me. And to our TPC family, Jeni and I want to express a huge thank you for all the wonderful meals you provided, and cards you sent, your calls and visits, and your prayers that continue to lift our spirits each and every day! You are the best!

Now that I've started cardio rehab, I hope to be back in circulation soon, and look forward to seeing all of you. In the meantime, please know how much we appreciate your support and encouragement. In grateful appreciation,

**DEACON NEWS!** You will receive the information below in an email from your Deacon. Please take a moment to read the role of a Deacon and respond to your Deacon.

The Deacons are busy making new changes and switching things up a bit. Kind of a post Covid Refresh. For starters, we used to be a group of 12 and now we're a group of 6. We're bringing back parish member newsletter stories and visiting people at home after church once a month. And we're giving you the opportunity to opt out if you don't wish to have a deacon. Please read on.

What does a Deacon provide?

Coordinate crisis care/meals, as needed. Contact our Parish regularly. Keeping you in the know with TPC happenings. Pray for our parishioners. On occasion, make homebound visits. Provide personal support to other Deacons. Hold Parish gatherings 1-2 times each year. Maintain confidentiality.

Deacon Job Description.

The office of a deacon as set forth in scripture is one of sympathy, witness, and service after the example of Jesus Christ. Persons of spiritual character, honest repute, of exemplary lives, brotherly and sisterly love, warm sympathies and sound judgement should be chosen for this office.

It is the duty of deacons, first of all, to minister to those who are in need, to the sick, to the friendless, and to any who may be in distress. They shall assume such other duties as may be delegated to them from time to time by the session.

It is the duty of deacons to attend to the needs of the congregation: to be a friend to others; to love another as Jesus would; and to meet monthly in fellowship.

**This is the part where we ask you to do a quick reply.** Just a simple YES or NO or NO RESPONSE please, stating whether you would like to still have a Deacon? If you opt out, you can join us anytime in the future. If you choose NO RESPONSE, nothing will change for you. You will still receive our emails. We will continue to pray and care for you no matter what. Thank you.

<u>Cost</u>: The \$5,000 Duke Divinity grant Sarah Beck helped secure for the Women's Ministry Group, allows us to keep registration at \$125 per person, which includes 5 meals and a shared room.

**Friday, September 16** - 5 pm arrival; reception at 6 pm; and dinner at 7 pm. We will have time to go over Saturday's agenda, maybe sing a bit, and play a game or two.

**Saturday, September 17** – Start the day with a walk or a fun workout for people who don't usually work out. After breakfast, you will experience a full day of enrichment and learning with Marianne. There will be time to reflect as you walk the labyrinth, participate in a fun art project with Sarah, and have opportunities to connect with old and new friends. Singing and games until lights out.

Sunday, September 18 - After breakfast, Marianne will lead a worship service and departure is at 11 am.

#### **COVID UPDATE**

It is finally feeling more like summer here. Hooray! However, the Covid-19 pandemic is not over. In Multnomah, Washington, and Clackamas counties, the levels of Covid-19 are still high. If you are gathering with friends or in large groups of people, know your risk factors and continue to take precautions. If you are travelling, you can go to CDC.gov to check

on Covid-19 levels at your destination and find recommended prevention steps. Please get your vaccines and your boosters.

To determine if you are eligible for a Covid vaccine booster, talk to your Primary Care Provider (PCP) or check out the tool at this CDC website: <u>https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/</u>recommendations/children-teens.html

Children 6 months and older are now eligible for Covid vaccines. Talk with your pediatrician or visit the CDC website for more information: <u>https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/</u>recommendations/children-teens.html

If you are exposed to Covid-19, have symptoms, or have tested positive, you may find this website useful for Quarantine or Isolation: <u>https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/your-health/quarantine-isolation.html#quarantine</u>

Be aware that we are currently seeing many false negative Covid home test results. If you have been exposed and/or you have Covid-like symptoms but test negative on a home test, please limit your exposure to others and get a PCR lab test. However, if you get a positive home test you have Covid.

If you are immunocompromised, there is now a medication called Evusheld that may prevent Covid-19 in people who are exposed. There are also anti-viral and monoclonal antibody treatments to lessen the severity of the disease for people who are at risk of severe disease from Covid-19 and have tested positive. Speak with your PCP for more information on these medications.

Lastly, please be respectful of and kind to others. If you choose not to wear a mask and encounter someone who is, please maintain a 6-foot distance. Chances are they are at increased risk, or trying to protect someone who is.
