SUCCESSFUL RESTART OF FELLOWSHIP DINNERS

After a three-year hiatus, Fellowship Dinners resumed in April, 2023. Participation did not suffer from the break for Covid. In fact, as a percentage of total TPC membership, we actually gained.

What are "Fellowship Dinners?" This program, which started in 2008, consists of groups of 7 to 9 people who gather for a meal and fellowship, usually dinner, once a month for four months. Then we shuffle the groups at random and start another 4-month phase. This is an excellent way for folks to get to know one another and enjoy fellowship together.

The plan: Historically, a new phase started in October, February, and June. That seemed to fit the annual cycle of TPC. By starting in April, we're two months off that historical schedule. We'll fix that by skipping August and January. The next phase will start in September. Sign-ups for the fall phase will start now and continue until August 20th. You may sign up now (if you plan to be away during August) by emailing Rick at TPCspirit org. There will be reminder sign-up announcements in the bulletin and newsletter during August.

How This Works: The hosts provide the main course and other attendees bring side dishes, dessert, etc. Sometimes games or activities are included. Each group decides the time that works best for all to gather. While most groups meet in the evening for dinner at someone's home, a brunch has sometimes worked best and other venues, like restaurants or TPC, have been used.

After each four-month phase the computer software comes up with new random groups. The computer algorithm avoids forming groups that put folks together who have recently been together. This gives everybody the chance to connect and meet more people in the church. New church members find this a great way to get better acquainted and longtime members find it a way to expand their relationships with other church members. THE 5TH OF 5 RECIPES FROM SOUPER BOWL SUNDAY SOUP & CHILI TASTING RED LENTIL SOUP, by Melissa Clark, New York Times, recipe and photo can be found on line



3 T chopped fresh cilantro

This is a lentil soup that defies expectations of what lentil soup can be. Based on a Turkish lentil soup, mercimek corbasi, it is light, spicy and a bold red color; a revelatory dish that takes less than an hour to make.

3 T olive oil, plus more for drizzling
1 large onion, chopped
2 garlic cloves, minced
2 tomato paste
1 tomato paste
1 tsp ground cumin
1/4 tsp kosher salt
1/4 tsp black pepper
Pinch of chili powder, or ground cayenne
1 quart chicken or vegetable broth
1 C red lentils
1 large carrot, peeled and diced
Juice of 1/2 lemon, more to taste

golden, about 4 minutes.
Step 2 - Stir in tomato paste, cumin, salt, black pepper and chili powder; Sauté 2 more minutes.
Step 3 - Add broth, 2 C water, lentils and carrot.
Bring to a simmer, partly cover pot and turn heat to medium-low. Simmer until lentils are soft, about 30 minutes. Taste. Add salt, if necessary.
Step 4 - Using an immersion or regular blender or food processor, puree half the soup, then add it back to pot. Soup should be somewhat chunky.
Step 5 - Reheat soup, if necessary, then stir in lemon juice and cilantro. Serve soup drizzled with good olive oil, dusted lightly with chili powder, if desired.

Step 1 - In a large pot, heat 3 T oil over high until hot and shimmering. Add onion and garlic. Saute until
