Cascades Summer Conference

"Last week was the annual Presbytery of the Cascades Summer Conference held on the campus of Linfield College. The theme for the week was "A Wideness in God's Mercy: Christian Faith in a Multi-Faith World." I decided to take in as much of it as possible and enjoyed my time immensely. Most of the attendees spend the week living on campus and having a true conference/ retreat vacation. I opted to commute each day, which did make it a bit disjointed, but well worth the time anyway.

I found the conference to be very organized, informational and lots of fun. Upon my arrival on Monday morning I immediately saw lots of longtime friends and pastors from around the Portland area. Morning worship began at 8:30 and there even was a conference choir to sing an anthem worship service! (Impressive!) during each Following worship was the keynote speaker Cynthia Campbell, President of McCormick Theological Seminary in Chicago. On the mornings that I was able to attend, she spoke passionately about our need to embrace all of Gods' creation. especially in the area of cultural diversity. The topic of one morning was: "Created in God's Image: Multiple Faiths and the Human Family." Another morning was the topic: "The Way, the Truth and the Life: Following Jesus Today." I enjoyed her messages and came away each time with much to reflect upon.

The morning wrapped up with a wide array of class options. I, of course, spent my time with the music crowd! Our instructor was Lynn Sjolund, a long-time music educator, conductor, and arranger from the Medford area. We spent each morning discussing creative approaches to the hymnal, which led to many interesting conversations! Following lunch each day, the afternoon music sessions found me brushing up on my conducting technique (it's been a long time since Conducting 101) and engaging the other class members in discussions of what works and doesn't work for them regarding their church choirs. It is ALWAYS an interesting time when you fill a room with choir directors!! There were many other options for both morning and

afternoon classes and I would have enjoyed participating in more of them if time had warranted it

For those who stay on campus, there is a wide array of activities such as swimming, games, fellowship times, Sing-alongs, movies, and even quiet time to read or nap! Programs are offered for children all the way up through high school.

I could easily see this was a week to mark on my calendar for next year! I highly recommend the Cascades Summer Conference to you all."

Picture Frame


Make a picture frame for your favorite summer photo. Hang it in your room or give it to someone special.

What you need:

- @ Glue
- Corrugated cardboard
- Scissors
- Your favorite summer photo

Directions:

- 1. Cut the cardboard into two matching shapes. (They can be squares, circles, triangles or some other shape.) Make the frame larger than the photo that you're using.
- Cut a window out of one piece of cardboard.
- 3. Glue the two pieces of cardboard together along three sides, but not on the fourth side. The photo will slide into this side.
- Glue decorations ponto the frame.
- When the glue is dry, slide your photo in.
