As you know, we have been in the "Pulpit Supply" process. What the heck it is? Good question! Maybe it's a glass of water, the hymnal, the Bible and anything else the pastor would need in the pulpit during Sunday worship. Wrong!!! When there is no pastor, such as when the pastor is on vacation OR the pastor requests his call be dissolved, then a church has no pastor. If we were a school, we would call this a substitute teacher BUT we are a Presbyterian Church, so we call it Pulpit Supply. We have pastors to be in the pulpit on each Sunday through the end of September. If we need to continue Pulpit Supply after that, we will. We thank Jack Hodges, Tom Johnson, Heather Chase, Charlie Brown, and Philip Martin for giving us their time and love. We will have Pulpit Supply until session chooses an Interim Pastor to lead us.

FROM THE DEACONS







The Peacemaking Offering is one of the four special offerings of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A). The purpose of the Peacemaking Offering is to support peacemaking efforts throughout the Presbyterian Church. In order to help the whole church do peacemaking, the Offering is divided as follows:

- 50% enables the Peacemaking Program to provide assistance and resources for congregations and other bodies of the Presbyterian Church,
- 25% is given to our Presbytery and synod for their peacemaking efforts,
- 25% is retained by our congregation for support of our peacemaking ministry -- examples: Tuesdays Treasures, Janus Program, and Quiet Waters.
