



A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KEN

“The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world’s deep hunger meet.”
-Frederick Buechner

Sometimes people ask me why it’s important that I say I’m a *Presbyterian* pastor. And what a great question. Why indeed Presbyterian? Why not Lutheran, or Episcopalian, or better yet, why not just plain Christian? Why hang on to this impossible-to-spell label? Is it really all that helpful? I wonder this myself sometimes. Especially since I spend most of my time telling folks how dangerous religion can be when it gets in the way of what God’s Spirit has in mind for us.

And yet I am terribly grateful to be part of a tradition. Though I’m not proud of every aspect of Presbyterian history (we have a few crazy uncles that make me extremely nervous), there are some things I believe we’ve done really well. And of the things I think we do well is the consistent emphasis Presbyterians place upon the doctrine of vocation, or call, in our theology. From Calvin onward we have insisted that it isn’t simply pastors and religious leaders that have a special calling. No. God calls each one of us to something of vital importance. God creates each of us with a purpose.

This is what writer and Presbyterian minister Frederick Buechner is getting at when he tells us the place we are called is the place where our deep gladness, not just a superficial kind of happiness, meets the need of the community around us. This kind of calling isn’t just for ‘religious’ people- it’s for all of us whether we be butchers, bakers, or candlestick makers.

Starting September 9th, TPC will also be focusing on this theme of call. In worship we will be studying texts having to do with vocation from every part of scripture. We will reinforce this theme with an art installation. We will also hold two very special events: one helping us hear the

call from TPC’s officers; and one aimed at helping us hear the call from one another.

On September 23rd our elders and deacons invite you stay after worship to see what they have planned for the year ahead, how you can help, and to learn what other ideas you might have. This is a great chance not only to learn more about the leaders of TPC, but also to find a way to give back.

On October 14th we will celebrate the various mission projects in which TPC members and adherents are involved. Now here’s the thing- while we will learn more about ‘official’ missions like the Tualatin Food Pantry and Tuesday’s Treasures, we also want to hear about the volunteer activities you participate in outside of TPC, such as the Oregon Donate Life, Medical Teams International (formerly known as Northwest Medical Teams), and the Red Cross. This is mission, too, folks. And others might want to help if they know the amazing things people are already up to out there. Further, we will learn about the concept of ministry groups, which I’ll write more about in next month’s newsletter.

It’s a new season. And God has something in mind for you. My deepest hope is that TPC can be help you discern this call in the months ahead.

As one more way of connecting you to what's going on at TPC, here is a quick summary of what happened at the most recent session meeting on Thursday, August 16th.

-Session welcomed Kris Sparks, who gave us a great update on some of the changes the choir has experienced this year (i.e. the All-Comers Choir) and her plans for Fall.

-Our clerk reported 3 new members joined by reaffirmation of faith in July, Betty Boyd, and Cindy and Stephanie Hoppe; as session voted to receive Stan and Marilyn Heath by letter of transfer. The clerk also read us thank you letters from our local high schools thanking the session for supporting their respective project graduation nights.

-Dr. Craig Bowen reported on the progress he has made regarding evening worship. This summer the youth have been invited to meet for dinner at 6:00 PM and Ken has led worship with them at 6:30. In the fall the full 2 hour program will be implemented on Sunday nights including games, learning, food, and worship. Great job, Craig!

-Scott Mitchell reported on great progress made in overhauling the way session reports our finances. Our goal is to have the ability to compare present actual data with historic data, to give us a better idea if we are ahead or behind of where we would to be.

-Finally, Ken presented his ideas for Fall and session did a fantastic job shaping and improving these ideas. This Fall we will focus on vocation and our goal will be to support this by preaching, worship art, and two special meetings after church to highlight different ways of getting involved. On September 23rd we will host an opportunity fair with every elder presenting what they've done, what they are planning to do this year, and what they would like to do with more support. Then, on October 14th we will hold a mission fair where we will inform the church about different mission opportunities as well as introduce the concept of ministry groups, which are small groups of people interested in working together for support.

The Oregon Coast at the end of summer is a marvelous place to be! The Eco-Justice Team of Presbytery of the Cascades' Congregational Support Committee, Presbyterians for Restoring Creation and the Eco-Justice Team of First Presbyterian, Newport, invite all who are interested in enjoying and caring for God's good creation to "Living on the Edge: Caring for Creation Where Land Meets Sea," on Saturday, September 22, from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at First Presbyterian Church in Newport. An optional aquarium tour and bonfire on the beach will also be offered. The opening keynote, "A Net Full of God," will be presented by The Rev. Irene Martin, from Skamokawa, WA, family fisher and author of Sea Fire, Tales of Jesus and Fishing. The second keynote is Ecology of Gray Whales on the Oregon Coast by Carrie Newell, Lane Community College instructor, OSU Ph.D. candidate, and expert on summer resident gray whales and their feeding behavior off the Oregon Coast. 


Youth: we see a CE program with filled class rooms on Sunday morning, 40-50 youth, and a young adult ministry
