Thanks for your attendence and support on Oct. 5 when we explained our progress toward building in 1987. We know that we will never have a design that is exactly what everyone desires but will listen everyones'comments. Remember, majority rules, so please keep an open dialogue with the committee. A couple of asked questions were at the meeting congregational that we would like to answer.

What is the deal with the wedding center? The total rent for the building is \$1,333 per month. Since that is more than we can afford, we entered a joint use aggreement with the "Wedding Center". They pay 50% of the rent and 6/7 of the utilities. In return, they have use of the building Monday thru Saturday. Their business is renting everything needed for weddings. During the week the sanctuary is set up as a wedding chapel. We have use of the building for meetings in the side room off the sanctuary, exclusive use of the pastor's office and use of the whole building on Sundays. We are fortuate to have them share this building and are glad for them putting up with our comings and going during their business hours. As a matter of kindness, when you come to meetings during the day and the parking lot is half full please park at Clark Lumber. That will leave parking for their customers.

Is n't the church building for sale? Max Clark owns the church and has the property for sale. Should the land sell, we would receive a minimum 90 days notice to move. If this happens, which we don't expect, we have the option to buy the building for \$5,000 and move it

to our property. With our sights on building in 1987 we don't plan to move this historic building.
