TPC Welcomes our Interim Pastor Rev. Dr. Richard C. Wiggers

Session is excited about the next growth stage for our TPC Community of Faith. We are looking forward to November 17, when Dick and his wife Jeni join us for worship and food (both of which we do very well).

Dick and Jeni are also excited about our interim period and looking forward to their time with us. The following information is from Dick's Professional Information Form (PIF) and from our Interim Pastor Search Committee's conversations with Dick and Jeni.

Dick brings a broad-based leadership approach seasoned by nineteen years of ordained ministry and thirteen years of corporate business experience. He was the Organizing Pastor of a new church development in Florida, which within eight years of his leadership ranked 11th out of 45 churches in the Presbytery of Florida in giving. Dick brings proven skills in the areas of evangelism, worship, mission outreach, stewardship, congregational care, leadership development and new member assimilation. He also has had formal interim training and served a call, for the past two years, as Interim Head of Staff at the 600-member congregation of Laguna Niguel Presbyterian Church in Southern California.

Jeni is a high school biology teacher and a symphony violinist. In Oregon, Jeni is hoping to teach part time and spend time with their son, daughter-in-law and grandchildren who live in Portland. She has a strong interest in building sense of community through small groups and book clubs.

The following quotes from Dick's PIF present a picture of his faith and the vision he brings to TPC. "I am grateful that my years of ministry have been filled with opportunities to work with members of all ages, especially with middle and senior highs (including the Logos program), college students and older adults (the subject of my 1985 Doctor of Ministry dissertation). I would welcome the opportunity to be a partner in ministry with the leaders and members of any congregation that is actively seeking to follow the leading of God's Spirit."

"My leadership style is "to equip the saints for the work of ministry" (Eph. 4:12). As a Minister of the Word and Sacrament, I feel called to help individuals identify and use their particular God given gifts to build up the Body of Christ."

"One of the ways that I seek to promote the healthy spiritual balance of receiving and sharing God's grace, is through the preaching of the Gospel which has the transforming power to comfort the afflicted and afflict the comfortable. It is also my practice to adapt my leadership style to most effectively meet the specific needs of the congregation that I am called to serve."

Session wishes Dick and Jeni safe and restful days as they visit with family and get recharged for their ministry with our TPC Community of Faith.



INITATIVE <u>AND</u> COMMUNICATION = A WINNING COMBINATION

In August I was appointed by Presbytery as Moderator of TPC's Session. Working with the Session and several of its committees, I have been very impressed with the way the elders and others are taking responsibility for keeping the routine going and for moving ahead to work on things which need attention. It is indeed exciting to see the vitality of our congregation and its leadership. The departure of Thom and Cindy Nelson to a new call in Michigan left us with a deep sense of loss. However, we have proven to be a resilient community of faith. We are both holding together and moving ahead. We even have a group of new members ready to be received. They are not coming because of a past or future pastor but because of all of us who are the congregation.

Great initiatives are being taken, but we have at times almost missed problems of conflicting plans; hence the title above. When Dick Wiggers arrives, he will bring experienced interim pastoral leadership. Coordination of church activities is an important administrative function of a pastor along with the session and the church office. With Dick's skilled leadership we can continue to move ahead, deepening our faith and strengthening our program while we undertake the careful process of clarifying who we are now, who we want to become and the qualities and skills we will seek in our next pastor.

In and through all we will be doing, good initiatives energized by faith and good communication infused with love are qualities, which will keep us both vital and well coordinated.

TPC Session Responsibilities 2002-2003

WORSHIP - Sherry Nelson

Plans and coordinates worship services in liaison with the Pastor. Provides wide opportunities for participation by the congregation as lectors, greeters, communion support and service, and offering collection. Coordinates with music and choir director.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION - Janet Winterrowd

Coordinates Church School year round for children and youth. Oversees nursery. Coordinates Vacation Bible School. Sponsors special events periodically during the year to promote and support Christian Education.

ADULT EDUCATION/FELLOWSHIP - Carolyn Hale.

Adult Education focuses on Bible study groups and adult study in conjunction with Sunday worship. Fellowship promotes opportunities for the congregation to get to know each other better, including Voyager groups, potlucks, and special events and seasonal gatherings.

YOUTH - Jerry Shiffer & Erin Nelson

Provides opportunities for High School and Middle School youth for fellowship, interaction, play, and mission work. Provides periodic opportunities for youth to participate in worship.

MISSION - Barb Harriman

Coordinates congregation's mission activities supporting our local, regional, and world community. Targets TPC's mission "tithe" toward specific needs recognized by the congregation.

OUTREACH - Del Judy

Coordinates with the Deacons; promotes recognition among congregation through nametags and address/photo directories. Recognizes visitors and makes them welcome. Conducts church publicity in the community.

BUILDING & GROUNDS - Dave Leland

Oversees condition of church property and building. Coordinates maintenance, repairs, and small-scale improvements for the building, support systems, and landscaping. Oversees janitorial services and extracurricular uses of the building and grounds.

ADMINISTRATION - Roger Smith

Oversees church finances and investments. Conducts stewardship pledging toward building and operating funds, and tracks offering and pledges. Conducts personnel functions including payroll, recruiting, reviews, and policies. Promotes scholarships and other support of seminary and college students.


TPC Communication Tower

"Centering Prayer" by M. Basil Pennington

This is one of the books we used during the recent Women's Retreat on Prayer. It deals with ways of renewing the ancient Christian prayer form of quiet and meditation. It introduces a new spirituality that is emerging, combining the wisdom of the East with our own Western traditions. If you are looking for a new approach to prayer, this is a good alternative to our usual concept of prayer.

Part of Father Basil's new approach to praying is the Centering Prayer, a series of Eastern Christian spiritual exercises such as the Jesus Prayer, forming a kind of Christ-centered "mantra". His book describes the special spiritual techniques involved in the new meditation, explains the heritage from which they spring, and tells us how to overcome problems that often discourage people from the act of prayer. This is a practical book on how to relax for prayer, how to overcome pain problems other encountered while attempting to attain the highest possible benefit from the act of praver.

M. Basil Pennington is a Trappist monk at St. Joseph's Abbey in Spencer, Massachusetts. He has traveled widely as a teacher, leader and lecturer on Christian spirituality.

This book can be found in our library under the Dewey Decimal number 248.3. It is listed in the card catalog under the subject PRAYER as well as by the title and the author's last name. Peaceful reading!

Piano Dedication Recital


A dedication recital for our new grand piano took place on October 27th. Several of our members participated and Rev. Philip Martin offered the blessing and prayer. This
