

ARE YOU READY TO SERVE ON THE TPC PASTOR NOMINATING COMMITTEE (PNC)?

At our last Session meeting, we decided to schedule two very important dates in the life of Tualatin Presbyterian Church: November 15th and December 10th. On Wednesday, November 15th, at our monthly meeting, the Session will look over names to nominate to the Pastor Nominating Committee. Then on Sunday, December 10th at a congregational meeting following worship, the Session will nominate seven (7) people to be elected by the congregation. The Session nominates. The Congregation elects. So, before November 15th if you would like to submit your name to be considered as a person serving on the PNC, now is the time! **But** before sending an email to Rev. Ken Henry at pastor@tpcspirit.org indicating your interest, keep reading. Make sure you understand what will be required of those on this committee and, ultimately, what it means to search for TPC's next full-time pastor. Besides being a member of the church, serving on the PNC requires:

Working with the Session, the Interim Pastor and other PNC members to prepare and submit a Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP). This document will tell potential candidates about TPC and why they should apply to be our pastor.

Receiving, reading, and evaluating Personal Discernment Profiles (PDP) from pastors around the country who are interested in the position.

Conducting video interviews, telephone interviews, and in-person interviews over a period of several months.

Watching sermon videos and/or even visiting another church on a Sunday morning to watch/hear a potential candidate preach.

Working with the Session and finance committee to establish terms of call (i.e. salary, housing allowance, moving expenses, etc.) that are fair but also within the church budget.

Practicing confidentiality and building trust among other committee members.

Praying and discerning who God is calling to TPC. This process may take up to year or even a year and a half.

PNCs normally meet twice a month, but as the candidate field narrows, it will probably require meeting more frequently. And typically, when the committee is down to two or three candidates, those pastors will spend a planned weekend in Tualatin to meet with the PNC face-to-face as well as preach in a neutral spot. Let me be clear. It will be hard work and will take some time discerning who will be the right pastor to lead TPC into the future, but this process can also be personally rewarding as you will be working with other people with whom you share a common goal.

If you feel God is calling you to serve on the PNC, please include in your email the answer to the following two questions:

- 1. Why do I feel God is calling me to serve on the PNC?
- 2. What gifts and experiences do I bring to the search process?



Howard's Heart A Message from Julie Flint, TPC Finance Assistant

As a board member of Howard's Heart, I asked TPC for the opportunity to share more about this organization and the impact it makes in the lives of local teens. Howard's Heart is a local non-profit organization

that supports teens in foster care. Stories of children in foster care have always been heavy on my heart and I had been searching for a way to help. When I discovered Howard's Heart and their mission of listening, showing up and providing direct support to the teens, I knew I wanted to be involved. During the annual holiday drive, over 300 teens submit their top 3 wishes and Howard's Heart does their best in fulfilling these wishes through monetary donations to purchase the items, individuals or groups purchasing the items from a teen's list, and/or groups holding gift card drives.

Throughout the year, Howard's Heart also provides essential hygiene supplies to the DHS teen units and for pick up at the Howard's Heart site as well as hosts a drive where teens can pick out their own school supplies through our back-to-school store. Their most meaningful program, however, is the special requests program, where teens can ask for anything, they want, need, or can't find elsewhere. This program runs year -round; in the five years Howard's Heart has been operational, donors have fulfilled every kind of request, from a favorite bag of chips to a cross country choir trip! In everything they give, their highest priority is letting teens choose what they need for their own individual journey.


