worship? It is the New Revised Standard Version Bible and there are several copies available in the cupboard behind the sound desk or you can check out the one in the library. Or if you'd rather do a comparison study or just read a different version, we have several variations in the library. There is "Good News New Testament and Psalms", the Revised Standard Version, the "New English Bible", the "New American Standard Bible" (just in case your English is not as good as your American!), and the New Oxford annotated Bible with apocrypha (this is the Revised Standard version that the Wednesday Bible Study group uses). Then if you want to make the Bible easier for your children to understand, we have "The Book For Children" and "The Story Bible" both of which edit the stories into easier to understand form. And, lastly, if all those variations are still too much, how about just listening to the New Testament on tape? There is a set of 14 cassette tapes of the New Testament in the library. This might be a nice thing to try in your car on your commute to work each day for a month. What a positive way to start your day! 
