ARE YOU BEING CALLED TO SERVE ON THE PASTOR NOMINATING COMMITTEE?

With prayer and perseverance, by the end of October (or early November), the TPC Session is hoping to nominate and bring before the TPC congregation a group of people to serve as your Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). This group will meet regularly to pray, discuss, read, learn, discern, and prepare the TPC congregation for a new pastor. This is easily a year-long commitment with meetings that can occur as often as 3-4 times a month. Some PNCs meet weekly. The Session has yet to determine the group size of the PNC, but as we digest and discuss the results of the on-line survey, we'll get to that question very soon.

If you are considering serving on the PNC, I'm letting you know now, it will involve more than reading applications and listening to sermons. Serving on this important committee is a Call. In the Presbyterian Church (USA), we believe God calls people to particular acts of service to further the Kingdom of God. Serving on the PNC will involve learning to trust others on the committee, exploring your own faith in God in Jesus Christ, and listening for how the God's Spirit is moving both at TPC and in the world around us. In my experience, people who serve on PNCs become close friends and upon calling a new pastor, some committee members wish they could keep the committee going forever and ever. But alas, all good things come to end.

In the coming months, the Session will be asking you to pray about and consider serving on the PNC. Caution: This process does not mean nominating someone else to do this work. Rather, it means discerning in the coming months how God is calling you to grow in your faith. Are you being called?

TPC READERS START SEVENTH YEAR!

Would you believe there are two fiction-reading groups at TPC who are starting their seventh year together this **September**! One group meets on **Second Thursday mornings**; the other on **Third Thursdays**. Both groups meet from **10 to 11:30 AM on Zoom**. Priscilla Hagan facilitates discussion of the monthly book selections of fiction books with spiritual themes.

In September 2023, our book is *While Justice Sleeps* by Stacey Abrams. Abrams uses her political and legal background to great effect here. This is an intelligent thriller that covers a broad range of topics: politics, genetic bioengineering, Supreme Court procedures, international biomedical company mergers, medical and military ethics, and a secret code based on chess moves.

October's book is *The Seed Keeper* by Diane Wilson. Rosalie Iron Wing grows up in the woods with her father, who tells her stories of plants, of the stars, and of the origins of the Dakhóta people. Many years later, Rosalie returns to her childhood home and begins a search for family, identity, and community. In the process, she learns what it means to be descended from women with souls of iron—women who protected their traditions with a precious cache of seeds through generations of hardship and loss. Weaving together the voices of four indelible women, *The Seed Keeper* is a beautifully told story of remembering our original relationship to the seeds and, through them, to our ancestors.

In November, our book selection is *Horse* by Geraldine Brooks. A discarded painting in a junk pile, a skeleton in an attic, and the greatest racehorse in American history: from these strands, Pulitzer Prizewinning author Brooks braids a sweeping story of spirit, obsession, and injustice across American history. Based on the remarkable true story of the record-breaking thoroughbred Lexington, *Horse* is a novel of art and science, love and obsession, and our unfinished reckoning with racism.
